Skilling for Recovery (Fee-Free Qualification)

Course Description This qualification reflects the roles of training developers and instructional designers who are responsible for analysing training needs and designing training solutions and products to meet workplace capability requirements, and evaluating the effectiveness of training programs. They may have a role in providing guidance and advice to trainers and assessors, promoting innovative practices, e.g. e-learning, and in researching and incorporating best practice in training and assessment into training programs and products.

FEE-FREE—SKILLING FOR RECOVERY

Fee-free training in Skilling for Recovery qualifications will support those most affected by



current economic conditions to gain skills in priority and growth industry areas, so they can take advantage of future job opportunities as the economy recovers from the effects of COVID-19.

The Fee-Free training will apply to anyone who lives or works in NSW and is unemployed or is at risk of unemployment. In addition to the above: Students that meet Smart and Skilled fee-free eligibility criteria (such as Aboriginal students and students with a disability) will continue to be eligible for fee-free training.

Entry Requirements

There are no entry requirements for this qualification, however it is desirable that candidates are employed in a role where they have maintained currency within the VET (Vocational Education and Training) sector and have either TAE40110 or TAE40116 Certificate IV in Training and Assessment.

Recommended Duration and Volume of Learning

The volume of learning for the Diploma of Training Design and Development as a Learning and Assessment pathway is typically 1 to 2 years (1200 – 2400 hours).

- *Unemployed (whether in receipt of Commonwealth benefits or not); or*
- *At risk of unemployment (eligibility criteria will be clarified shortly as this is a new initiative) or*
- *Be 17—24 years of age (regardless of employment status)*
